Angels Baseball Foundation Donates \$50,000 for LA Fire Relief

Many individuals and families, including those who lost their homes or remain displaced due to the Altadena fire, are struggling with food insecurity as a result of the financial challenges that exist. Some individuals whose homes were spared are still unable to gain access, leaving them with the financial burden of making a mortgage payment and homeowners insurance payments in addition to paying for their temporary housing. Others whose homes were lost were



unable to afford housing in the area and have had to seek housing further away, leading to a costly commute in addition to the cost of other necessities. As was the case when the fires broke out, Abound Food Care has once again been asked to fill a critical role in filling a food insecurity gap. Drawing on their emergency response experience, the Abound Food Care mobilized quickly to provide meals and coordinate regional support - reinforcing the importance of agility, preparation, and partnership in disaster response.

Thanks to a generous \$50,000 donation from the Angels Baseball Foundation, and additional financial support from Messiah Lutheran Church in Yorba Linda, Ca., Abound Food Care, in conjunction with the city of Pasadena will provide targeted food services to city staff who find themselves still impacted by the wildfires. This investment will support the production and distribution of nutritious, ready-to-eat meals now and while the need exists. Abound Food Care continues to work closely with regional and national partners to ensure resources are deployed efficiently across the communities most affected and looks forward to working on behalf of the Angels Baseball Foundation, the City of Pasadena and our partner stakeholders to provide nutritious food to those that work in support of the residents and businesses in Pasadena. New Sacramento County Grants to Strengthen Regional Food Recovery



grant cycle in 2024 in Sacramento County, Abound Food Care is excited to launch the 2025 grant cycle on behalf of the Capital Food Access Alliance. The second grant cycle supports the introduction of an Equipment Grant, offering food recovery organizations essential resources such as freezers, refrigerators, scales, and thermometers to enhance their operations and increase capacity. Additionally, the Expansion Projects Grant will offer up to \$150,000 for large-scale initiatives. Eligible projects include shared fleet development, repurposing kitchens, innovative food recovery models, and other solutions aimed at strengthening food access and food recovery across the region.

Abound Food Care's Coordinated

Logistics pilot project is officially underway in Orange County, CA. The Samueli Foundation funded pilot project, conducted in collaboration with Second Harvest Food Bank of Orange

County, aims to identify and coordinate transportation resources to create a streamlined and efficient logistics model utilizing existing vehicles and infrastructure. The Abound Food Care logistics team is coordinating nonprofit and food industry refrigerated vehicles used to rescue excess edible food from retail grocery stores. Abound Food Care additional routes utilizing driver workforce development opportunities.
